Unit C, Chapter 4 & 5:

- 1. We face **the Qiblah**, the direction towards the Ka'bah, when we pray.
- 2. This action is called sujood:



- 3. Ramadan is the month in which Muslims fast. Fasting/Siyam is one of the five pillars of Islam.
- 4. In Ramadan, we learn how the **poor and hungry people** must feel. We learn self-control and great manners.

Unit D, Chapters 1-6:

- 1. Muslims are all brothers and sisters in Islam. We are all one **ummah** (a community of Muslims).
- 2. All Muslims believe in One God, Allah (swt) and follow the same prophet, Muhammad (saw).
